# BECOME A MICHIGAN VETERAN CONNECTOR

## **Enhance Services to Those Who Have Served**

You can help to better serve the veterans and their families in your organization by asking whether they served in the military and informing them about the **Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency** (MVAA). They may qualify for health and other benefits and MVAA can help get them connected with these and other resources.



#### **HOW TO IDENTIFY VETERANS**

It isn't always obvious when someone is a veteran and those who don't publicly display their veteran status are less likely to be connected to veteran benefits and resources. Some of these people may not even consider themselves a veteran. It's important to ask the following question:

#### "Have you or a member of your household served in the military?"

If they answer yes, offer them one of MVAA's cards so they can learn more about the benefits and resources that may be available for them.

#### Michigan Veteran Connector Designation

Please see attached website banner and poster. Organizations electing to implement either of these materials or those who contact Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency (MVAA) for a free consultation on other methods to identify and connect service members, veterans, and their families to earned benefits will receive a "Veteran Connector Designation" from MVAA.

Our community organizations within Michigan can greatly improve access to veteran centric resources by the simple act of displaying how to connect to their earned benefits. As many are not aware, the more connected we can get our 550,000 Michigan veterans to benefits, the lower their rate for self harming behaviors such as suicide or opioid overdoses. In addition, these veterans may be eligible for potential VA disability compensation, financial assistance with long term care expenses, or other veteran centric resources.

The **Michigan Veteran Connector** designation will symbolize your organization's ongoing efforts to proactively support and connect service members, veterans, and their families to earned benefits.

Those who receive this designation will also be eligible for the below items:

- "Michigan Veteran Connector" badge to display on website and/or email signature block.
- Logo displayed on MVAA website as a "Michigan Veteran Connector".
- Access to the Michigan Governor's Challenge Psych Armor Portal which contains free veteran centric training and resources.
- Introductions to the local contact for the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity Veteran Employment Services Manager & Workforce Development.
- Introductions to the MVAA Employment Analyst and MVAA Education Analyst.
- Introductions to the MVAA manager for the Buddy-to-Buddy Veteran Mentorship & Community Engagement and Regional Engagement Initiative.
- Free veteran centric materials including but not limited to printed materials, business cards, and resource guides.
- Ongoing support from the MVAA Health & Welfare Analyst and MVAA Partnership Coordinator.

#### Michigan's Veteran Connector Designation for Health Systems and Community Partners

The Michigan Veteran Connector recognizes health systems and community partners that are committed to supporting the needs of service members, veterans, and military-connected families.

These organizations are awarded this designation based on their veteran and family centric services and programs. Any health system, medical office, long-term care facility, or community partner in Michigan can apply for this designation.

#### Michigan Veteran Connector Program Criteria (must meet at least 4 criteria to be designated):

1.	Established process for identification of service members, veterans, and immediate family members within the Electronic Medical Record and/or intake process Yes No
2.	Veteran-specific webpage with links to resources and supports and/or placement of "Have you served" banner on website Yes No
3.	Designation as a Veteran Friendly Employer at any level; see MVAA - BECOME A VETERAN-FRIENDLY EMPLOYER (michigan.gov) Yes No
4.	Utilization of MI Governor's Challenge Psych Armor training portal that contains both suicide and veteran centric training. Evidence by at least one registration from organization (register at <a href="Governor's Challenge Portal">Governor's Challenge Portal</a> — Psycharmor). — Yes — No



MVAA houses the emergency financial assistance program, Food4Vets food voucher program along with the Buddy-to-Buddy Program. - Veterans Crisis Line. If you are having thoughts of suicide, call <u>1-800-273-8255</u>, then PRESS 1 or visit <u>veteranscrisisline.net/</u>. For emergency mental health care, you can also go directly to <u>your local VA medical center</u> 24/7 regardless of your discharge status or enrollment in other VA health care.
